

FEBC Eurasia May Prayer Focus

Thursday – 1

“I was so inspired to help children in need after listening to your programs,” said Irene, from Ukraine. “I even started praying for them. But what I didn’t realize was that I still didn’t know Jesus myself. It was only after I called you that I finally understood. As you described God’s love, what Jesus has done, forgiveness, and God’s promises, it finally became real to me. I no longer just had the desire to do something nice, but to actually know God. Now, when I listen to your programs, I’m amazed that I had somehow missed it! Thank you for loving me and for telling me about my Father in heaven!”

Friday – 2

Please pray for an end to the war in Ukraine. We greatly need the grace of our Lord, and His guidance for our leaders. Please pray for an end to the fighting and death, and for healing to come to Ukraine in the name of Christ.

Saturday – 3

Please pray for those from FEBC Moldova’s team who interact with listeners in the comments. These conversations help listeners to take the next step, whether visiting a church or leading them to put their faith in Christ.



Sunday – 4

“I am so thankful to have found your programs online. When I was at my lowest moment, I was looking for anything to help. I found out so much about myself through your programs. I realized I was looking for my value in other people, looking to them for meaning. At first, your talk about the Bible seemed so foreign to me. But as you spoke about Jesus, something in me cried out. I didn’t understand everything, but I prayed along with you to accept Jesus. He has healed so much of my heart. I am still growing, but I am seeing my

transformation already.” Please pray for listeners like Alina, who are coming to know the Lord and finding new meaning in their lives.

Monday – 5

Please pray for FEBC-Ukraine’s counselors who are answering many calls and chats, praying with listeners, helping them heal through family breakdowns, trauma, fear and anxiety, and hopelessness and depression. Most importantly, however, they introduce these listeners to Christ, sharing the Gospel with them, praying with them, and connecting them with local Christians who can help them grow.

Tuesday – 6

Please pray for FEBC-Moldova’s children’s programs, to which many parents and children have been responding. We have heard of many children who started apologizing to friends for lying after listening to a program about lying. Please pray for many children and parents to “become friends with Jesus.”



Wednesday – 7

“I thought I was okay,” said Olga, a 90 year old woman from Ukraine. “I thought that God would accept me. I’ve been a good person, I thought. I haven’t done anything truly bad. Recently, I fell down. Hard. I hurt my head and my leg. It made me start to consider my life. What would have happened if my fall had been worse? Thank you for leading me to the Lord. For praying for me and encouraging me. It came so late in my life, but being able to turn to God, my Father, for comfort and love...it means the world to me. And now, my daughter and I are reading the Bible.” Please pray for listeners like Olga who are starting their walk with the Lord.

Thursday – 8

Please pray for FEBC’s programs reaching Jewish listeners in Ukraine with the Good News. “I was hesitant when I first started listening to you because I knew that you were a Christian. But you kept bringing on Rabbis who talked about God in a way that I had never heard. I wanted to know more, so I visited the messianic church that you recommended. It

was so full of life and joy. I've been going there for a few months now, and I am a follower of Yeshua!"

Friday – 9

Please pray for FEBC-Moldova's Bible programs. We have heard from many families and youth pastors who use the programs to disciple children and young people around them.

Saturday – 10

"I sort of believed in God, and I didn't. I'm not really sure," said Elena, a young lady from Ukraine. "When I heard you talk about God's love—His love for me personally—I wanted to believe. So I decided to do what you said and tried praying. For a long time, I was depressed, and hated the way I looked. After I prayed, my anxiety and depression was gone. I felt peace, quiet inside, for what felt like the first time." Please pray for young people like Elena, who are finding belonging and love in Christ through FEBC's programs.

Sunday – 11

Please pray for the safety of FEBC-Ukraine's broadcasters. Several are working as chaplains, and others are travelling across the country, speaking with listeners. Sometimes they are very close to the frontlines.

Please pray for FEBC-Moldova's technical team, a small team that has a passion to reach the people of Moldova with the Good News. They help to produce powerful, innovative videos that reach hundreds of thousands of people.

Tuesday – 13

"I just got out of prison," wrote Alexandru, from Moldova. "I became a Christian while I was inside, but since I've gotten out, I've fallen back into sin. The temptation seemed too great. I felt like I was unforgivable. But when I saw your video, I felt such relief. Jesus forgives! Now I am back on track, walking with God, and no longer trapped in my sin!"

Wednesday – 14

A man came up to me on the subway this morning, said Alina, one of FEBC-Ukraine’s broadcasters. “I recognized you from your program,” he said. “Hearing you talk about Jesus gave me hope, even where I’m going.” He was on his way to the frontlines. Two other soldiers have come up to me saying something similar. Please pray for these men, many of whom are losing their lives.

Thursday – 15

Please pray for FEBC-Russia’s leadership team, Victor, Alexey, and Oleg as they face immense challenges coming from government restrictions on religious freedoms and

Friday – 16

“I don’t want to go home,” said Artem, a soldier who got leave to go home for the first time since enlisting. “I don’t want to scare them. I’m not the same person I was when I left.” FEBC-Ukraine’s prayer evangelists helped Artem work through his fear, helping him understand how to be open with his family, and prayed with him. The number of soldiers who are coming home broken and traumatized is only increasing. Please pray for the Lord to reach the soldiers with the healing power of the Gospel.

Saturday – 17

Please pray for FEBC-Ukraine’s in-person listener meetings that have been scheduled for later this year. Especially for “Embrace”, a meeting that offers spiritual and emotional support to military wives and war-widows. We have meetings planned in Kyiv, Summa, and several other cities across Ukraine. Please pray for protection for those attending and for many to come to the Lord through these meetings.



Sunday – 18

Please pray for FEBC-Russia’s vloggers as they reach many young people with the Gospel through their daily videos. “I never thought about prayer before watching your videos. I felt like I was going through life alone. My parents don’t understand me. When I first saw your video, I wanted to laugh...but I kept watching. You had problems too, but when you talked about turning to God, I felt hope.”

Monday – 19

“I thought God was punishing me,” said Ludmila. “My life had not gone like it was supposed to. I felt ashamed, worthless. Every day I would cry until my head hurt. I am so thankful that you were there for me. When I called you, I didn’t have much hope...until you told me about the love of God and prayed with me. Now I know that my God loves me and I listen to your programs all the time! Thank you!” Please pray for listeners like Ludmila who are finding hope in Christ.

Tuesday – 20

I visited one of my listeners in the hospital, said Inna, one of FEBC-Ukraine’s broadcasters. He is a soldier who was injured in the war. “I’m more spiritual than religious,” he said. “But I’ve been listening to your program here. I’m learning a lot about God, and some things are starting to make sense that I never understood. I play your program on loudspeaker, and the other soldiers here listen to your program with me.” I gave him a pocket Bible, said Inna, and told him more about Jesus. Please pray for him to put his faith in Jesus and find eternal life.



Wednesday – 21

Please pray for FEBC-Russia’s broadcasters who host live programs. “It is a powerful thing to respond to listeners directly in the broadcast,” said Eugene. “It helps them feel heard. Even aggressive listeners usually respond well when I speak to them with love. Suddenly, people who thought Christians were dumb or crazy are praying with me on the air. I can see how God is working to reach the people of Russia. Thank you for your prayers!

Thursday – 22

We have seen powerful results from a Christian concert held by FEBC-Kazakhstan during a holiday. Many non-Christian Kazakhs came to the concert, and some were streaming the concert live to their non-Christian audience of thousands. Please pray for this concert to continue bearing fruit in the Kazakh community, opening people's hearts to the Good News.

Friday – 23

"I don't know what to do...everything has been taken from me," said Max, a soldier in Ukraine. "I can't go back to the frontlines because of my severe frostbite. While I was at the war, my wife died, my stepchildren are now living with their biological father. I miss them. All I have left are panic attacks and sleepless nights." FEBC prayer evangelists prayed with Max, leading him to Christ. Please pray for the many people who have experienced great loss during this time of war. It has been long and brutal, wearing people down. Please pray for the Lord's healing and strengthening.

Saturday – 24

Please pray for FEBC-Ukraine's programs for children, introducing them to Jesus and inviting them to become "friends" of Jesus. Children will sometimes visit the studio in Kyiv with their parents to meet the broadcasters.



Sunday – 25

Please pray for FEBC-Kyrgyzstan's new team members who are helping make our programs and helping listeners find them. Altynbek and Ilyas are two new hosts of a Bible program sharing Jesus and the Scriptures with Muslims, and Arthur is helping on the technical side, making sure that our programs reach our listeners. Please pray for God to bless their work and lead them.

Monday – 26

“I was so overwhelmed after we had our second child,” said Maria, a young mother from Ukraine. “Every day, I worry about my husband—he’s serving on the frontlines. I am working part time, taking care of our two young children. I felt like I was at my breaking point. I had never thought about turning to God, it seemed almost silly. But when I learned about your prayer helpline, I decided to try. You changed my life. It’s still hard—very hard. But now I know that I’m not alone, and that my Father will never abandon me.” Please pray for the tens of thousands of women in similar situations in Ukraine as the war rages.

Tuesday – 27

Please pray for several members of FEBC-Ukraine’s team who are currently undergoing cancer treatments. Please pray for God’s healing and comfort as they fight this illness.

Wednesday – 28

Please pray for Ulanbek Karypov, who is leading the FEBC-Kyrgyzstan team. He has been having some health problems. Please pray for healing and strength from the Lord.



Thursday – 29

“I lost my little girl the day before yesterday,” said Kateryna, a young woman in the midst of grief. “My husband died a year ago. I feel lost... guilty... confused—why would God let this happen? I didn’t want to talk to God, I was so angry. You said that He loved me, even when nothing that happened made sense. I didn’t want to hear that. But as we kept talking, things kept coming up in my heart, things I wanted to say to God. Some not so nice. It was the first time I wanted to talk to God at all since my daughter died. When we prayed together, something changed. I was able to let go of a lot of the things I was carrying. Thank you for listening, for helping me talk to God again.”

Friday – 30

“The young people of Moldova are struggling,” said Olga, one of FEBC-Moldova’s prayer counselors. “Many teenagers write to us, asking questions about life, wanting help with problems with their parents, and even thinking about committing suicide. Please pray for the young people of Moldova, many of which are growing up without real support or parental figures.

Saturday – 31

Please pray for FEBC-Kyrgyzstan’s search for a production studio where they can film and produce local programs and videos for their outreach to their Muslim audience.
